New Rochelle Park Passport (Formerly Omnicard)

Overview. The **Park Passport** is New Rochelle Parks and Recreation’s photo identification card. It is required for individuals who wish to use **Hudson Park and Beach, Five Islands Park, Davenport Park, Cameron Dock, Sharkey Park, Neptune Park, Lincoln Park**, and for those seniors who wish to participate in the activities at the **Hugh A. Doyle Senior Center**. The **Park Passport** is valid from January through December.

Requirements. The **Park Passport** requires photo identification and proof of residency. Proof of residency is 2 permanent items that show applicants name and address, i.e. driver’s license, vehicle registration, utility bill, tax statement lease, and or rent receipt.

Fees. The fee for a **Senior Resident** aged 62 plus is **\$40.00** for a **5-year** card.

Senior Passports are available for purchase as follows:

- \$180 for a gold 10 month Passport (Sept-June)
- \$150 for a silver 7 month passport (Sept-Nov & Mar-June)
- \$15 per day-time “FILM” for non passport holders
- \$8 per day-time program for non passport holders
- \$10 per day-time Sunday programs for non-passport holders
